## Highlights...

- In August, ten months after opening, the Wister Center was awarded Gold LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) certification by the U.S. Green Building Council, exceeding our expectations! It is the only Gold LEED building on Swarthmore College's campus.
- Over 1,062 memberships in the Scott Associates supported the Arboretum's efforts in 2010.
- On March 14, William McNamara was presented the 2010 Scott Medal and Award of \$12,000 by Swarthmore College President Rebecca Chopp in recognition of his outstanding work as director of the Quarry Hill Botanical Garden, Glen Ellen, California, and his leadership in conserving endangered flora.
- On November 18, *Red Steelroot*, a sculpture by Steve Tobin was donated to the Scott Arboretum by an anonymous Scott Associate donor and installed in front of Alice Paul Residence Hall.
- The Arboretum conducted 153 educational programs and special events which drew 7,234 participants in 2010.

## Mission

The Scott Arboretum was "given for the purpose of enabling Swarthmore College to acquire, cultivate and propagate the better kinds of living trees, shrubs, and herbaceous plants which are hardy in the climate of eastern Pennsylvania and which are suitable for planting by the average gardener."

Dear Friends of the Scott Arboretum,


In 2010 we had a new, beautiful, and environmentally sensitive home for many of our programs in the Wister Education Center and Greenhouse. In its first full year of service, the space transformed our educational programming, our volunteer program, and of course, our ability to propagate and grow plants. Because of its beauty and utility, it has also provided an unexpected introduction to the College community and broader community since the Gillespie Room has quickly become a popular space for a variety of meetings and horticulture gatherings, bringing College staff, faculty and students, and new visitors to the Arboretum facility and into the orbit of our activities.

When, in August 2010, we were notified the Wister Center achieved Gold LEED status, our high goal of achieving silver was pleasantly exceeded. This building now has the distinction of being the only building on the Swarthmore College Campus with this notable designation.

In 2010, I celebrated 20 years of service as director of the Scott Arboretum. I hope you sense while reading this report, my sense of appreciation for being a part of this special place for two decades, and for the varied and unique synthesis of plants, people, and programs we know as the Scott Arboretum. My appreciation to the many who have lent their time, talent, and financial support in 2010 to help create these achievements and given us the means to enrich the lives of visitors, Scott Associates, Swarthmore College students, and members of the community. # Scott Medal & Award

On March 14, William (Bill) McNamara accepted the 2010 Scott Medal and Award of \$12,000 presented by Swarthmore College President Rebecca Chopp at the annual Spring Festival held in the Lang Performing Arts Center. Bill was the 56th recipient. This prestigious award program was conceived and established in 1929 and has continued since then due to the philanthropic funding by Margaret and Owen Moon, Arthur Hoyt Scott's sister and brother-in-law. The purpose of the award is by recognizing an individual who has made an outstanding national contribution to the art and science of gardening: "to promote a greater love of nature, make the nation more conscious of the beauty of the outdoors, develop a greater knowledge and love of plants and flowers, spread the gospel of better planting and designing, and arouse a wider interest in better planting and more beautiful gardens among all citizens."

Bill McNamara is well respected for his 20 years of work at Quarry Hill Botanical Garden located in Glen Ellen, California where, in 2007, he was appointed executive director. He has also made substantial contributions to our knowledge and conservation of endangered flora having completed more than 20 botanical and plant collecting expeditions to Asia. He has previously been recognized by the Garden Club of America with the Eloise Pryne Luger Medal.

As specified as a condition of the original gift fund, the recipient is selected by an eight-member committee consisting of representatives in the horticulture profession outside of the Scott Arboretum of Swarthmore College. The 2010 Selection Committee included: Rick Colbert, Director, Tyler Arboretum; David Culp, past chair, Hardy Plant Society Mid-Atlantic Group; Tom Fischer, Executive Editor,

Timber Press; Sharon Loving, Director of Horticulture, Longwood Gardens; Elizabeth Scholtz, Director Emeritus, Brooklyn Botanic Garden; W. Gary Smith, Principal, W. Gary Smith Design; Dan Stark, Executive Director, American Public Garden Association; and Gwen Stauffer, Executive Director, Lotusland Foundation. The committee was chaired by Stu Hain, Vice President for Facilities, Swarthmore College; Claire Sawyers, Director of the Scott Arboretum served as secretary; both non-voting positions.

# Education

In 2010 it is unknown how many benefitted by the “visual demonstration” from the beauty of our gardens and plant collections; however, we counted 7,207 as participants in planned educational programs such as guided walks, workshops, and lectures held throughout the year. We pride ourselves on being among the most accessible public gardens in the region given we are free and open to the public every day of the year, offer free parking, and many forms of free educational materials from plant labels to brochures to cell phone tours to our website providing extensive garden and collections information.

Counting Swarthmore College students, staff, and faculty who “visit” the Scott Arboretum through the course of their classes or work, we can claim that about 2,000 benefit daily from “the beauty of hardy plants,” at least from August to May when classes are conducted.

Here are summaries of educational events and programs held in 2010 (alphabetical by program name):

## Arbor Day Celebration

On April 29, Arbor Day was celebrated at the Scott Arboretum with 522 elementary students and teachers gathering in the Cherry Border for a symbolic tree planting. Mayor of Swarthmore Rick Lowe delivered the Arbor Day Proclamation. All students were given a free tree to plant at home, choosing either an Eastern white pine (*Pinus strobus*) or Norway spruce (*Picea abies*).

## Arboretum Assistant Updates

As a form of continuing education for all volunteers, known as Arboretum Assistants, we conduct a series of specially designed educational programs free for volunteers. In 2010 five updates were held including one focused on the new Wister Center (Feb. 25); a trip to Woodlands Cemetery (April 28); reviewing John Wister’s rhododendrons (May 19); Gold Medal plants (Aug. 17); and one on overwintering tropicals (Nov. 4). A total of 201 attended these updates (an average of 40 per update).

## Community Garden Plots

The Arboretum provides the opportunity for Scott Associates to grow vegetables and food crops for a nominal fee on 23 – 10’x12’ plots. Seventeen families participated in this program in 2010.

## Conferences

The Arboretum planned and hosted two major conferences in 2010. On July 16, the 14th annual Woody Plant Conference drew 470 to campus to participate in a day-long event featuring five noted speakers: Tim Boland, Executive Director, Polly Hill Arboretum; Patrick Cullina, Vice President of Horticulture and Park Operations, Friends of the High Line; John Grimshaw, Garden Manager, Colesbourne Park, Gloucestershire; Dan Hinkley, Plant Hunter and author; Gary J. Johnson, Professor of Urban and Community Forestry, University of Minnesota.

On October 15, the 27th annual Perennials Conference drew 501 and gave participants the chance to learn from: Eric T. Fleisher, Director of Horticulture, Battery Park & City Parks Conservancy; Dale Hendricks, plant propagator; Holly Scoggins, Associate Professor in Horticulture, Virginia Tech; John Greenlee, founder of Greenlee Nursery; and Piet Oudolf, award-winning garden designer.

Both of these conferences, sponsored with various other public gardens in the region who see these events as important ways for us to fulfill our educational missions, allow us to draw the best talent while keeping the registration cost at a minimum and while using the Scott Arboretum collections for “visual demonstrations” supporting the lecture content.

## Educational Brochures

Free educational brochures on over 20 different Scott Arboretum plant collections, gardens, and horticultural interests were offered to the public in 2010 from brochure boxes placed throughout the Arboretum as well as on our website so visitors are able to print those of interest before a visit or independent of a physical tour.

## Greens Sale

The annual Greens Sale held December 4, was staged in the Wister Center and offered holiday cheer with a warming fire outside and beautiful green holiday décor for sale inside. Thanks to the creativity of talented volunteers, the sale of wreaths, swags, and bundles of greens earned just over \$4,000 to support programming, nearly doubling last year’s results. In addition to the great efforts of many who assisted, the dry bright weather certainly helped with turnout; an estimated 120 came to purchase. The event also encouraged five new memberships and several renewals, since new members each received a free bag of greens.

## Lectures

A variety of horticultural lectures were offered throughout the year as a part of the Arboretum’s educational programming. Supported by the Scott Associates, and/or the Hardy Plant Society, many of these were free and open to the public. They included: “Native Perennials: From Field, Forest, and Wetlands to Test Tubes” by Stephanie Cohen; “Sensory Appeal of Native Plants” by Greg Tepper; “Strategies for Deer-Proofing Your Garden” by Brad Roeller; “Managing the Environment: An Adaptive Challenge” by Eric “T” Fleisher; and “How Permaculture Can Save Humanity and the Earth but not Civilization” by Toby Hemenway. Three hundred and sixty attended these lectures; an average of 72 per lecture.

# Education

## Nature's Narratives

This program, launched in 2009, provides a forum to share in the reading of books about plants, nature, and the environment. Meeting either in the Scott horticultural library or the Wister Center, the group discussed these books last year: *Deep Economy* by Bill McKibben; *Animal, Vegetable, Miracle* by Barbara Kingsolver; *American Chestnut: The Life, Death and Rebirth of a Perfect Tree* by Susan Freinkel; *The World Without Us* by Alan Weisman; *Gathering Moss* by Robin Wall Kimmerer; *The Monkey Wrench Gang* by Edward Abbey; and *Biomimicry* by Janine Benyus. Designed to be small group discussions, an average of about eight, a total of 60 participated in these seven sessions in 2010.

## Scott Scoop on Gardening

A new program launched as a trial in the fall of 2010 was aimed at weekend Arboretum visitors when we typically have not had a staff presence. Volunteers and staff manned the Wister Center on Saturdays through September and October to meet and greet visitors and assist them with their gardening interests and questions. A total of 150 were assisted on eight weekends.

## Swarthmore College Events

In support of special times in the College's academic year, the Arboretum conducts a variety of programs that are in part celebration and, we hope, ways to engage curiosity about the plant world. Each August we welcome incoming first year students during orientation week with a free houseplant and a chance to repot it; each May we bid farewell to graduating seniors with a rose pinned to their graduation robe from the Rose Garden, and a graduation gift plant of *Itea virginica* 'Henry's Garnet' (named at the Scott Arboretum; garnet is the school color). In between we welcome new faculty and staff with Arboretum orientation sessions; and we offer tours to families and alumni on their special weekends. With the opening of the Wister Center in 2009, we were able to resume "Houseplant Clinics" in 2010 as special times designed to assist students, staff, and faculty with houseplants.

## Swarthmore College Student Program

Special ongoing learning opportunities are offered to Swarthmore College students interested in working during the academic year. A variety of positions in collections care, gardening, educational programming, publicity efforts, greenhouse management, and the Good Food Garden project are funded by the Arboretum. In 2010, 18 students worked in paid Arboretum positions (see page 8).

## Tours

Throughout the year over 60 free guided tours of the Arboretum's gardens and plant collections were offered to the public. These included "Walks with the Curator," special tours to our green roofs, "Photo Walks" especially designed for photographers, several tactile tours especially for the visually impaired, and seasonal highlight tours. The Arboretum also offered guided tours as benefits to organizational members of the Scott Associates. The total count of participants on these tours was 931. Several cell phone tours were available in 2010 as well, allowing visitors to learn from staff members even after regular business hours.

## Travel Program

Creating opportunities to see other gardens and horticultural endeavors, whether on day trips or further afield, provides pleasurable and experiential learning. In 2010, day-long trips ventured off to the Pennsylvania Farm Show on Farmer Day (Jan. 13); to see private gardens of the Baltimore area (May 26); to visit gardens of Milford, Pennsylvania (June 23); to visit North Creek Nurseries and the Dansko Headquarters (Aug. 19); and the High Line and Battery Park City in New York City (Oct. 6 & 20).

Longer trips included a three-day trip to the "Gardens of Charlotte and Asheville, North Carolina;" and a 14-day trip to "Mexican Gardens in Colonial Cities" in January. Travel programs accommodated 228.

## Travels at Twelve

The garden-travel lecture series continued with great popularity in 2010, its 19th year. Held weekly starting in mid-January and continuing into March, these lunchtime events are opportunities to vicariously travel and they serve as great antidotes to the winter doldrums for gardeners. In 2010, total attendance reached 661; an average of 110 per lecture. The speakers, predominantly staff or former staff members, shared their travels to China, Corsica, France, Martha's Vineyard, the Midwest, and the Appalachian Trail.

## Workshops

To provide hands-on horticultural training, the Arboretum offers small classes and workshops beautifully accommodated through 2010 in the Wister Center Gillespie Room and head house. Topics covered in 15 sessions focused on peonies, culinary herbs, oaks, witch hazels, vermiculture, wreath making, sustainability, nature journaling, and landscape management. A total of 282 participated with an average class size of 19.

# Horticulture

## Plant Collections

The Scott Arboretum displayed 9,731 woody plants representing 3,230 taxa (types of plants) at year's end for the education of beginner gardeners and the edification of all who come here. The woody plant collection represents 95 plant families. An additional estimated 2,000 different types of herbaceous plants – perennials, tender perennials, and some annuals – are also incorporated into gardens on campus; however, they are not accessioned.

Collections of particular note include: the James R. Frorer Holly Collection consisting of roughly 350 taxa and recognized by the Holly Society of America as a National Holly Collection; our collection of magnolias with about 165 taxa; and our collection of oaks with about 60 taxa. These three collections are recognized as part of the North American Plant Collections Consortium (NAPCC) administered by the American Association of Public Gardens. The Arboretum's collections of roses, rhododendrons, tree peonies, witch-hazels, conifers, and Gold Medal plants are also noteworthy.

## Plant Records

To manage our woody plant collection and make it possible to use for educational purposes, we maintain an extensive plant record system, including accession and display labels, and a computerized mapping system which ties to accession records, utilizing programs known as BG-Base and BG-Base Map.

In 2010, 402 new woody plants were accessioned and 414 were removed (due to death or deletion). During the year, 9,699 plants were mapped utilizing satellite technology known as the Global Positioning System, making 94% of the collection up-to-date on our maps.

About 800 display labels were engraved and placed over the course of the year. Since 2000, when this mapping system was initiated, the percentage of the collection mapped has steadily grown to this new high number.

As a result of Andrew Bunting's participation on a plant collecting expedition to China in the fall, 186 seed collections of potentially ornamental plants were added to our propagation benches.

## Plant Evaluation

In order to display the “best” plants for home horticulture, ongoing evaluation is an important aspect, so we support and cooperate in other plant evaluation programs in line with our mission. In 2010 we participated in the Holly Society of America's holly evaluation, the Gold Medal Award program of the Pennsylvania Horticultural Society, and the National Boxwood Trial Program.

## Garden Maintenance

In 2010 volunteers contributed 1,795 hours of gardening alongside our gardening staff on campus. An additional 244 volunteer hours were given to maintaining the Wister and West Gardens. Special attention was given to new plantings around the Wister Center and its parking lot, and the Chica Maynard Whisper Bench in the Cherry Border thanks to the Maynard Memorial Fund.

## New Features

A special landscape feature, a sculpture called *Red Steelroot*, representing the trunk and roots of a tree, by Steve Tobin, was donated to

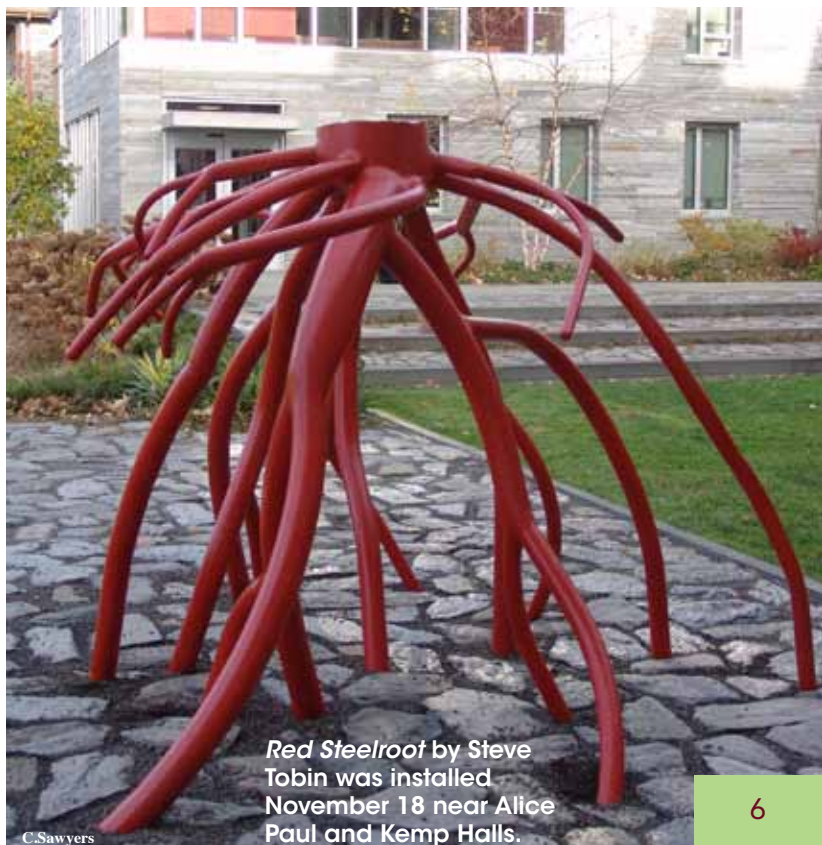
the Arboretum and installed in November in the courtyard of Alice Paul and Kemp Halls. This dramatic work of art, with an appraised value of \$125,000, is particularly appropriate in the Scott Arboretum as a place appreciative of trees, including their underground portions. A special thanks to the generous anonymous donor for this unique nature-inspired piece that now is a focal point in the Gold Medal Plants Garden and a favorite icon for students residing in these Halls.

## Crum Woods Stewardship

A distinct part of the Scott Arboretum known as the Crum Woods is maintained as a natural area and forms the western edge of the campus. Composed of about 200 acres of woodland, this area has particular value as one of the largest “natural areas” to remain in Delaware County. Though planted extensively with native plants in the early years of the Arboretum, current efforts are focused on the removal of exotic weed species, trail maintenance, trash removal, and stream bank stabilization plantings.

On April 22, the annually held Crum Woods Clean Up occurred, resulting in staff and community volunteers gathering and removing 34 bags of trash from the woods and creek. During the winter months of 2010, 360 additional volunteer hours supported our efforts to care for this area.

Additional funding for Crum Woods efforts is provided by the College through the Crum Woods Stewardship Committee chaired in 2010 by Jeff Jabco, Coordinator of Horticulture/Director of Grounds, and Colin Purrington, Professor of Biology. The committee meets monthly during the academic year and 2009-10 members included the following additional staff and faculty: Maurice Eldridge, Presidents Office; Stu Hain, Vice President of Facilities and Services; Nadine Kolowrat, Development; Stacey Kutish, Communications; Jose-Luis Machado, Biology; Betsy Bolton, English Literature; Claire Sawyers, Director of the Scott Arboretum. Swarthmore College students are also appointed to this committee each year.

# Administration

## Finances

Given the Scott Arboretum relies heavily on endowment earnings for its operating budget, the 2009-10 fiscal year was challenging with the continued effects of the recession on the economy and the endowment. While the value of the endowment recovered some over last year, it remained \$4.7 million below the high market value on June 30, 2007 of \$27,164,373. The distribution of \$873,109 in fiscal year 09-10 is nearly 19% less than the distribution amount in the previous year (Table 1).

Areas where the budget was reduced last year continued, meaning plant purchases, staff travel and development, and printing of publications were minimized, although salaries were increased on average 2.5% following a year of salary freezes (Table 2).

At the close of fiscal year '09-'10, with the construction of the Wister Education Center completed at \$3.7 million, about \$380,000 remained to be raised for construction costs. Donations and funds raised during 2010 have been largely directed at retiring this loan which is on target to be completed by June 30, 2014.

## Marketing and Publicity

In 2010 the Scott Arboretum participated as a member of Greater Philadelphia Gardens (GPG), a consortium of over 30 gardens within 30 miles of Philadelphia ([www.greaterphiladelphiagardens.org](http://www.greaterphiladelphiagardens.org)), working together on marketing and promotion of all our public gardens. In 2010, GPG released seven seasonal guides, averaged 3,000 web visitors per month, had 950 weekly GPG newsletter subscribers, 400 Facebook friends, and produced a new color brochure outlining all member gardens. Claire Sawyers, director served on the executive committee of GPG in 2010.

Our own publicity efforts continued in the form of regular mailings to Scott Associates, press releases to local media, and electronic communications. The mail log indicates we mailed over 22,000 pieces in 2010, advertising events and programs throughout the year to our members and interested friends. In 2010, 82 blogs, "Garden Seeds" were released. In its second full year, there was a total of 199,798 "visits" to these blogs, an average of 16,650/month.

\*Notes: All Arboretum restricted endowment funds were managed by Swarthmore College. Group A funds are treated as separate accounts to which direct charges are made for their specific purposes. Unspent monies at the end of the fiscal year are carried forward in these accounts, and no college overhead is charged to these funds.

Funds in Groups B and C are charged overhead expenses (based on the regulated College overhead rate of 58% less the 30.7% for benefits or 27.3% of salaries), and crew time by the college. These funds are not managed as separate restricted accounts within the Arboretum.

2010 marked the 39th year the Scott Associates have supported Arboretum programming and efforts in a variety of crucial ways. Here are some of the notable Associate accomplishments of the year:

## Arboretum Assistants

In 1987 the first class was held to train “Arboretum Assistants.” Since then 13 more courses have been offered to build and maintain a volunteer force of 100-120 Arboretum Assistants.

In 2010, a total of 8,559 hours were given to the Scott Arboretum by Arboretum Assistants, ranging from time devoted to tool maintenance and gardening to greenhouse, library, office assistance, and special events. Given the estimated dollar value of volunteer time for 2010 is \$21.36 per hour according to the Independent Sector, this means our volunteer group gave us \$182,820.24 worth of volunteer support.

## Associates Finances

In fiscal year 2009-10 Scott Associates operating income totaled \$167,076 (not counting the Plant Sale) with expenses of \$97,134, leaving a balance of \$69,942 as of 6/30/10 (See Table 3). 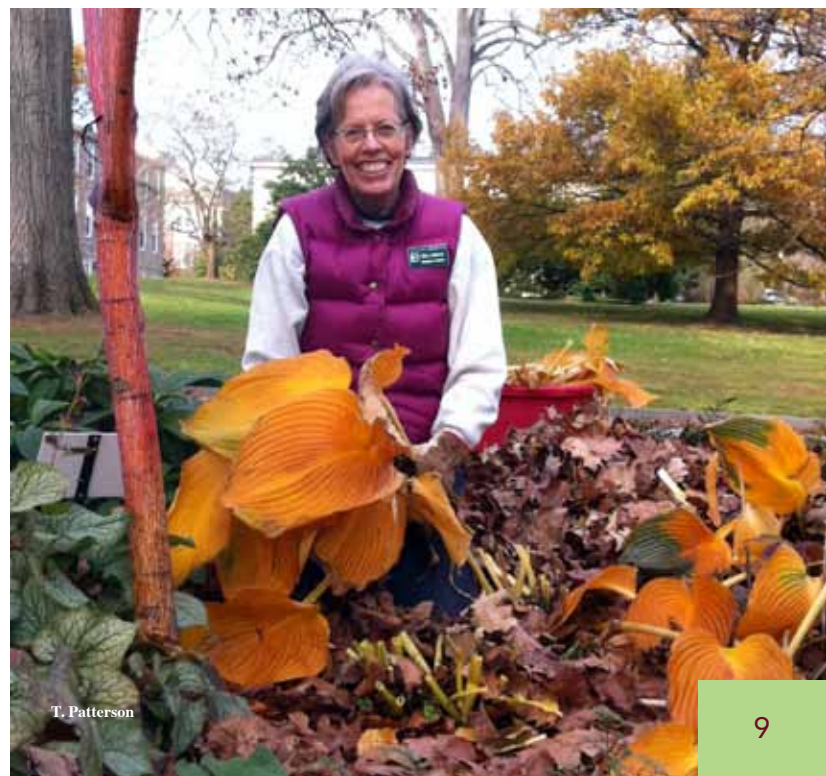
## Education

## Garden Day

Garden Day, an annually held tour of private gardens, featured six exceptional gardens in the Chadds Ford area on September 12, 2010. Over 270 Scott Associates and interested members of the public participated, enjoying the gardens of Mary and Shipley Allison, Amy and Ed Borer, Richard and Diane Gies, Kitty May, Nora Sadler and Charlie Banks, and Pat and Dennis Smith. Following the tour, the Borers also hosted a reception. Thanks to all these garden owners for generously sharing the fruits of their gardening creativity and labors. Thanks to Chris Lindstrom, Chair; Carol Bock, Vice-chair; Jan Goren who oversaw the reception; and Sue Clendenin who lined up all the other Garden Day volunteers for a great event!

## Library

In 2010 library volunteers gave 436 hours to library maintenance, more than double over the previous year. Special efforts to inventory and assess the collections were accomplished in 2010. As a benefit to the Scott Associates, members can check out over 1,300 gardening books and have access to dozens of gardening periodicals and newsletters from other gardens and horticultural organizations. Thanks to chair Sally Dow and library volunteers Rae Foley, Ron Gatto, Lis Hammons, Maria Hingley, Verdie Thomas and staff member Becky Robert for their regular library work and ongoing efforts with managing this resource.

## Members Plant Exchange

Altogether 2,940 plants were donated by volunteers or organizations with 82 plant donors generating the bulk of that impressive offering. Some Associates plan their spring around this event given how affordable it is to leave with a car full of new plants for their gardens. After the exchange portion of the event, the remaining plants are sold at nominal rates (mostly \$1 per plant); 140 participated in the event.

The sale portion resulted in proceeds of \$1,789, an increase of 51% over last year. An additional contribution of \$650 came from Redbud Nursery who participates through a potting soil sale. Thanks to Cindy Kerr for her enthusiastic leadership in organizing the 15th annual Members Plant Exchange.

## Membership

The Associates of the Scott Arboretum numbered 1,062 memberships at the close of 2010, providing the organization \$78,290 in support through membership dues, a slight increase over 2009. Members at the Sponsor level and above are invited annually to a Special Event. On May 18, 2010, this event was hosted by Geoffrey and Sandra Shepard at their extraordinary Rose Valley home and historically interesting garden; 83 attended.

## Festivals

## Sunset Sippin’

In 2010, the fourth year of the Sunset Sippin’ program offered participants the opportunity to enjoy a different garden of the Arboretum on three evenings, each accompanied by cocktails and gardening friends. June 17 featured wines of Black Walnut Winery, July 22 featured beers of Wyerbacher, and on September 16 Bluecoat distillery returned. A total of 133 participated; a special thanks to our sponsors who donated their beverages, helping these evenings raise \$1,155 for programs.

## Visitor Ambassadors

In 2010, given the opening of the Wister Center in the fall of 2009, we were able, with the support of volunteers, to provide a weekend presence for visitors. Each Saturday in September and October from 10-2, two “visitor ambassadors” were available in the Wister Center to answer gardening questions, provide Arboretum sight-seeing information, and related visitor information. The program continued in the spring of 2011, with modifications based on this fall trial. With the Wister Center open and manned on weekends, we have been able to address one of the strong recommendations to improve visibility in the community that resulted from the Museum Assessment Program conducted in 2009. Thanks to our 2010 Visitor Ambassadors (see list on page 14).

## Winter Celebration

On January 15 the Associates held the 29th annual Winter Celebration in the Science Center drawing 105 for a lecture by former Scott gardener Greg Paige entitled “Garden Chapters: A Horticultural Journey of Plants, Peoples, and Places,” followed by a delightful reception in Eldridge Commons.
