WINTER BIRDS OF CRUM WOODS

ABUNDANT:

almost always seen in proper habitat

rock dove (*Columba livia*)
mourning dove (*Zenaida macroura*)
red-bellied woodpecker (*Melanerpes carolinus*)
northern flicker (*Colaptes auratus*)

COMMON:

usually seen in proper habitat

turkey vulture (*Cathartes aura*)
sharp-shinned hawk (*Accipiter striatus*)
red-tailed hawk (*Buteo jamaicensis*)
ring-billed gull (*Larus delawarensis*)
great horned owl (*Bubo virginianus*)
downy woodpecker (*Picoides pubescens*)
hairy woodpecker (*Picoides villosus*)

UNCOMMON:

seen infrequently

Canada goose (*Branta canadensis*)
mallard (*Anas platyrhynchos*)
Cooper's hawk (*Accipiter cooperii*)
herring gull (*Larus argentatus*)
eastern screech-owl (*Megascops asio*)
barred owl (*Strix varia*)
yellow-bellied sapsucker (*Sphyrapicus varius*)
pileated woodpecker (*Dryocopus pileatus*)
